

HFG Questions for
“Adam vs. Christ”
(Romans 5:12-21)

1. What was "the Fall"? Who fell from what? Who was responsible for sin entering our world? And where do we find that account in Scripture?

2. Because of sin, something else--something disastrous--also entered the world. What was it? (Gen. 2:17; Rom. 5:12)

3. Adam lived to be 930 years old, and presumably Eve lived about the same length of time. So how did they "die" on the day that they ate the forbidden fruit? (Gen. 2:17; 5:5)

4. How does Adam's sin affect us, our children, and our grandchildren? (Rom. 5:12c)

5. How are people who have never heard the written Law of God still held accountable by Him for their sins? (Rom. 2:14-15)

6. How was Adam's sin an act of ultimate selfishness? In contrast, how was Christ's death an act of ultimate selflessness? (Rom. 5:15)

7. Which is greater, God's hatred for sin or His love of the sinner? Explain your answer.

8. At first glance, Romans 5:18 appears to be teaching that everyone will eventually get saved. How do we know that's NOT what it means? And what DOES it mean?

9. The Law brings with it condemnation of sin, with death following after. What are the results of being in Christ? (Rom. 5:20-21)

10. Have YOU accepted God's free gift of salvation for your eternal soul that comes alone through Jesus Christ? AND IF NOT, what's holding you back?
